



Currants

Variety	Fruit/Growth	Zone/Growth/Fall Foliage
Consort Black	Ripens late in the season, black fruits with strong flavor, medium in size. Very productive, immune to white pine blister rust, only moderately susceptible to powdery mildew. Self-fruitful.	Zone 3. Height 4-6' Spread 4' Ripens: July-August
Red Lake	Clusters of large bright red berries. Semi-erect and vigorous. Very productive. Fruits are good for jams or jellies. Self-fruitful.	Zone 3. Ripens: July-Aug. Height 3-6' Spread 3-4'

Gooseberry

Variety	Fruit/Growth	Zone/Growth/Fall Foliage
Pixwell	NDSU introduction 1932. Very productive. Pale green fruit turns pink when ripe. Few thorns.	Zone 3. Ripens: July-Aug. Height 3-5' Spread 3-4'

Honeyberry – require pollinator.

Variety	Fruit/Growth	Zone/Growth/Fall Foliage
Berry Blue	Large blueberry-tasting fruit great for fresh eating, jams, jellies or pies. Vigorous, hardy, drought tolerant. Use Tundra or Borealis to pollinate.	Zone 3. Height 4' Spread 3' Ripens: Early Summer
Borealis	Honeyberry's taste has been compared to blueberries, blackberries, raspberries and currants. Eat them fresh, make jams, jellies or pies. Excellent source for Vitamin C and antioxidants. Needs Berry Blue or Cinderella for fruit set.	Zone 3. Height & Spread: 4' Ripens: Early Summer
Cinderella	Perfect for any yard, honeyberries are tasty fresh, on ice cream, used in pies, jams and jellies. Flavor like blueberries, blackberries, raspberries or currants. Good source of Vit. C and antioxidants. Use Borealis or Tundra to pollinate.	Zone 3. Height & Spread: 3' Ripens: Early Summer
Tundra	Fruit is large. Berries taste like wild blueberries with a hint of black currant. Great for fresh eating or making jams and jellies. Use Berry Blue or Cinderella to pollinate.	Zone 3. Height & Spread: 4-5' Ripens: Early Summer

Juneberry

Variety	Fruit/Growth
Regent	Extremely hardy, native to Regent, ND. White flowers in spring. Fruit matures as purple, red or almost black color. Fruit is about 1/4". Great eaten fresh, or used in wines, canning, pies, jams and jellies.

Rhubarb

Variety	Fruit/Growth	Zone
Chipmans Red	Bright red stems are delicious for sauces and pies. One of the sweetest of the red rhubarb.	3

Strawberries

Variety	Fruit/Growth	Zone
Fort Laramie	The berries are large and sweet with good flavor and texture. Everbearing, harvest all summer long.	3
All Star	Excellent flavor. Resistant to verticillium wilt disease. Junebearing, crop ripens in June.	4

Asparagus

Variety	Fruit/Growth	Zone
Jersey Knight	High production of male plants which produces larger spears. Green color.	3
Purple Passion	Tender spears are deep burgundy color. More tender, mild and sweet than other varieties. Vigorous.	3

Hops – grow as vines

Variety	Fruit/Growth	Zone
Bianca	Vigorous, decorative climber, foliage resembles grapes and is dark lime green, contrasting nicely with the red-brown stems. Bell shaped hops are very attractive. Flowers are yellow.	3
Nugget	Vigorous vine that quickly wraps itself around any upright structure. Produces papery cone-like hops later in the summer, typically used to produce beer. Will die back to the ground each winter.	3
